

"Next is your restaurant bill." continues Mr Barnier, "In the same manner we have to make arrangements in advance with our catering suppliers Your average restaurant bill was in the order of £300 a month, so we'll require payment of £3,600 for the next year." "I don't suppose you'll be letting me have these meals either?" asks Mr Davis. "No, of course not," says an irritated Mr Barnier, "as you are no longer a club member, you are not entitled to dine here!"
