#### **Healthwatch Southend**

We would like to share the news from Mid and South Essex Hospitals regarding the Emergency Department service.

From 1<sup>st</sup> December 2020, residents who think they need to visit their local hospital emergency department will be asked to call NHS 111 first. If needed, they will be given an appointment to go to the ED and the NHS 111 team will let them know when the patient is coming. For those with life-threatening illness or serious injury, the 999 service remains in place.
