

Heart rate app is a hit at home with patients

A new app has been launched for 400 patients to monitor their hearts for palpitations and murmurs, which can cause strokes and heart attacks.

The Fibricheck app is

being trialled across the county by the Essex Cardiothoracic Centre (CTC) at Basildon Hospital.

It can be downloaded on a patient's smartphone to test their heart rate remotely, with the results being seen by a specialist heart nurse.

The app uses light technology through the phone's camera. The patient puts their finger over the lens for one minute and the camera picks up blood flow in the finger.

Sharon Toora, CTC lead arrhythmia nurse specialist, said: "This is really going to benefit patients as they won't have to make the journey into the hospital to get their heart rate results; it's all done in the comfort of their own home.

"If there are any concerns with the results, we speak to the patient over the phone and this avoids face-to-face check-ups. When we speak to patients we can tell them what medication we will be prescribing for future care to make them feel relaxed." Funding for the app has come from a special Covid Appeal fund and charitable funds from Mid and South Essex Hospitals Charity, it's already getting great feedback from patients who are using it. One of those is Stephen Messer, 67, a retired plumber from Rayleigh, who had a quadruple heart bypass in 2013. He recently used the app to monitor heart palpitations. He said: "I was checking my heart rate three times a day and getting the results back really quickly from the team which meant I wasn't splitting my day up travelling back and forth and having to park at the hospital. "It's so easy to use and fit into my day-to-day life, and I'm now managing my condition through medication, thanks to the app."



- Early data shows a third booster dose prevents about 75% of people from getting any Covid symptoms from Omicron.
- Protecting the NHS from being overwhelmed with Covid-19 patients is increasingly important during the winter months and due to the emergence of Omicron.
- The NHS is now set to offer every adult a booster vaccination by the end of the year.





#### Covid News: Who can get a booster vaccine?

From Wednesday 15 December, all those over the age of 18 can book their Covid-19 booster vaccination as long as it has been three months since your second dose.

#### Why do I need to have a booster vaccination?

- Booster vaccinations are our best defence against Covid-19. particularly with the emergence of the Omicron variant. Omicron is projected to become the dominant variant in the UK by mid-December, based on current trends.
- New data suggest that vaccine protection against mild symptomatic disease from Omicron may be substantially reduced as protection from the original two doses starts to wane. Effectiveness against severe disease is still unknown but expected to be higher. ......Continued on page 13
